Dear Trinity Community,

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry recently preached at the wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle. He's been making the talk show rounds proclaiming the love of God for all.

In his sermon he quoted the late Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who said, "We must discover the power of love, the redemptive power of love. And when we do that, we will make of this old world a new world, for love is the only way."

He said, "There's power in love...power in love to help and heal when nothing else can...power to lift up and liberate when nothing else will...power to show us the way to live." He spoke of the love of the couple and how this love brought everyone together that special day. He went on to remind everyone that the love we share comes from the amazing and abundant love of God.

The Presiding Bishop continued, "Someone once said that Jesus began the most revolutionary movement in human history. A movement grounded in the unconditional love of God for the world - and a movement mandating people to live that love, and in so doing to change not only their lives but the very life of the world itself." He went on to imagine what the world might look like when everyone from families and friends to governments and nations live in this way – "no one will go to bed hungry; justice will roll down like a mighty stream and righteousness like an ever-flowing brook; poverty will become history; the earth will be a sanctuary; we will lay down our swords and shields, down by the riverside, to study war no more."

"When we love this way", he said, "we actually treat each other like we are actually family. When

love is the way, we know that God is the source of us all, and we are brothers and sisters, children of God. My brothers and sisters, that's a new heaven, a new earth, a new world, a new human family." What an incredible picture Presiding Bishop Curry painted about the transforming, redemptive power of love that comes from God, the source of us ALL.

The day after the wedding, the Church celebrated Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit to the close followers of Jesus after his Ascension. The power of God's love was experienced through the sound like that of a violent wind that filled the whole house followed by divided tongues, like fire, that rested over each of them. THEN, those faithful followers of Jesus who had been living in fear for their lives suddenly became empowered by God's redemptive love and began to live lives that were so very different.

I am reminded of First John 4:18, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." The lives of the disciples were empowered and changed in ways no one could imagine as they boldly shared God's love for the rest of their lives – no matter what the consequence. This love, indeed, changed the lives of the world then and has changed history forever. We are an important part of this story of God's transforming love. God's love transforms us and God's love through us transforms the world.

As summer begins may we notice the ways God's love is in the world, the ways we are being transformed by this love and this continuous cycle of each transformation changing the world and us.

ORFF INSTRUMENTS

We have borrowed several Orff instruments from First Congregational Church in Saginaw to use with our choirs. We used them for several Introits in May. Members of the choir played the instruments while the rest of the choir sang.

The Orff Schulwerk, or simply the Orff Approach, is a developmental approach used in education. It combines music, movement, drama, and speech into lessons that are similar to child's world of play. It was developed by the German composer Carl Orff (1895–1982) and colleague Gunild Keetman during the 1920s. Carl Orff worked until the end of his life to continue the development and spread of his teaching method.

The Orff Approach is now used throughout the world to teach students in a natural and comfortable environment. The term "schulwerk" is German for (literally) "school work" or "schooling", in this regard in the area of music.

We are thankful to First Congregational Church for the use of these instruments.

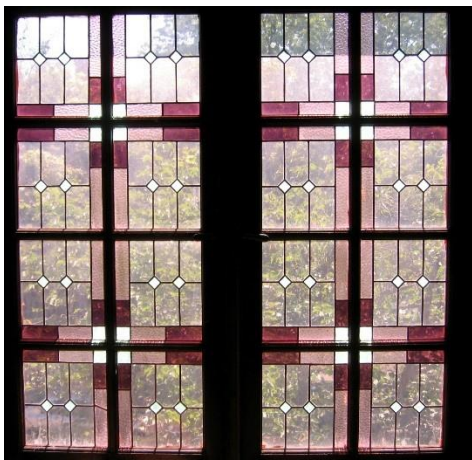
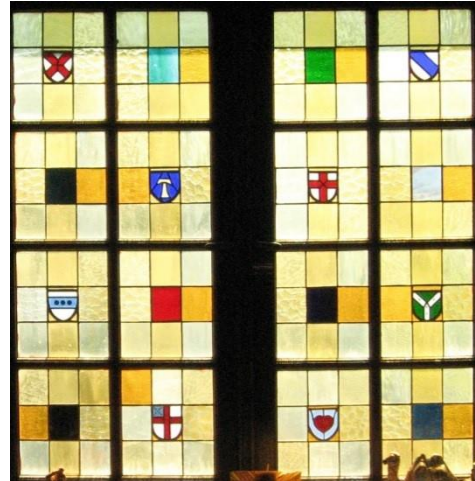

Here, we let the pictures speak for themselves with different symbols of the Christian faith – the dove, flame, ship, IHS, cross and various shields to name a few. Here, we are reminded of what God’s grace, human imagination, and vision can do. The Sunday School Chapel Windows.



If you’ve never been upstairs and have never seen the Sunday School Chapel, you’re in for a treat that’s a feast for eyes young and old. The Sunday School classrooms and Chapel area were part of the addition and expansion to Trinity Church in 1924. The Children’s Chapel has a large altar, stations of the cross, candle holders and candles and several memorials given to the Glory of God and in memory of different parishioners.

Among the memorials are the stained glass windows created by former parishioner and Sr. Warden, Captain Roy Atkinson. In the early 1980s he and then rector, Fr. Herbert Catlin, restored the stained glass in the church tower.

With the experience of that restoration, “Captain Roy,” as he was affectionately called, undertook his next project: Creating stained glass windows in the Sunday School Chapel. “Captain Roy,” attended the U.S. Naval Academy graduating with a degree in Electrical Engineering. A quiet soul, he dedicated his life and then retirement to service. Even in his 80s, he volunteered for Habitat for Humanity. He entered his eternal home on his 90th birthday in 2012. May we follow his footsteps in lives of service to God and human kind.
