TOWER CHIMES PLAYERS NEEDED!

Every Sunday morning before Trinity’s worship service, the historic Tower Chimes ring out with familiar hymns to prepare us for worship. This public instrument can be heard not only in our own worship space, but in the surrounding community as well.

Trinity’s Tower Chimes are getting ready to celebrate 100 years of sounding praise to our Lord. The Deagan Company installed over 1000 of these instruments around the country - and now there are around 400 left and less than 20 working ones in Michigan.

Patrick Winningham is looking for anyone interested in learning how to play the Tower Chimes. There are only 10 notes that are played on a small keyboard. Anyone with at least basic keyboard (note reading and playing) skills can be successful playing simple hymns on the Tower Chimes. The Chimes get played from 9:40 AM to 9:50 AM before worship every Sunday.

**Trinity Church
Her People, Her Building
Then and Now**

Gleanings from the Past

Here, we go back in time to 1881 and look at the *Trinity Bell*, the church's early bi-monthly newsletter, Vol. VII., No. 5. It is an excellent primary-source document as to the background and information on the Stone Chapel and many other things. We must also remember that the area of Center Avenue and Grant Street was not built up at that time and so the "new" chapel, even though a half-block north of Center, was a very prominent and visible structure.

The New Chapel

We have heard but one comment from all who have seen the new building, whose substantial and beautiful walls are now approaching completion. From the Bishop and other visitors, so well as from our own people the universal expression is that of gratification and surprise. We believe that this, the first stone building erected in Bay City, is one of which not only our parishioners, but also our citizens may well be proud. The position brings all its strong and handsome lines into full view from the street, and gives it the appearance of being a larger building than it is. Certainly no one who has contributed towards the work can fail to be gratified with the result so far as realized.

From the report of the Building Committee read on Easter Monday it was plain to everyone present that if the chapel is to be completed this Fall we must all give something more to do it with. The sum already expended, or that the Parish is under contract to expend, amounts to about \$7,500. As the Sunday School is ready to purchase the windows the above amount includes everything belonging to the building

proper, excepting the front steps. Before the building can be used, however, there is grading and furnishing to be done, and, as there is less than \$6,000 of subscription to work with, it is plain that \$2,300 to \$2,500 additional must be donated before the chapel can be occupied. Without additional subscriptions the work will have to stop with the completion of the roof.

Neither the Vestry nor the Rector are willing to run in debt, and we are much mistaken if the congregation is not of the same mind; consequently, if we are to have a convenient and home-like place for our Sunday School, weekday services and social gatherings this Winter, and if we are to be able to worship with any comfort next Lent, then we must do our very best to be liberal givers this Summer. The interest shown in the first subscription was so general and so generous, that we cannot but think that each member of the congregation will do his or her part to keep up the good work until the chapel is completed and ready for occupancy, then we shall all have not only the enjoyment of its beauty, but the larger enjoyment of its comfort and its usefulness.
