Dear Trinity Community

Wow, my heart is full! Thank you, thank you, thank you to all who helped make our Harvest Dinner and the Faith Alive weekend such successes. It is clear that each and every person who planned, bought items, made phone calls, provided food, washed dishes, set and cleaned up tables, donated items, prayed, provided housing for our guests, provided transportation, made visits to our home parishioners, or participated in any way, made these two big events possible.

Over this short period of time, I saw people step into roles they'd never done before, I saw individuals step out of their comfort zone to try something new, I saw members of Trinity hear one another's stories and get to know each other better and grow closer to God. I also saw God's immense love pour out of this community.

I had the privilege to hang out with our youth and had a great time. We found God's abundance expressed in so many ways. There were two or three youth at each session who were joined by five team members and one Trinity adult.

The room upstairs has been transformed into a youth group room. The furniture was rearranged and decorations were collected and put in place. Friday conversation led to the service project for Saturday. I was asked if I knew of a nursing home and thrift store they could visit on Saturday. As you can imagine, I told them about Rachel Sovereign Memorial Home for Women across the street that Trinity

helped begin. I went to the Veteran's Thrift Shop on Midland Street and to Rachel Sovereign to make plans. We went to the Veteran's Thrift Store first. Before we entered, we stood in a circle and prayed that God would guide each of us to the two items that were meant for us to give to the women at Rachel Sovereign.

We then went in and, listening to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, each found two items. The team leaders and I were talking about whether or not to go get more cash or to let God provide for two loaves and five fish worth of funding. Just then the cashier came up and told us that he and the store manager were so impressed with the project we were doing that they were going to give this all to us for free! A donation was made to help them in their work to house and feed veterans in Bay County.

Then off to Rachel Sovereign we went, praying in the parking lot for God to direct us to the women to whom our items were meant to go. Staff took us around to the sitting room, living room and bedrooms.

In the end, all the items were given away. Many of the women were touched by God, some even to tears. And some of us had tears, too.

As we debriefed our experience, each of us had different stories but the threads of gratitude and joy filled our hearts as we had done such a simple act that was touched by God which revealed God's abundance that blessed us all.

On October the 18th Mary K. and Katharine Freel attended the planting of a young Linden tree in honor of Donald R. Freel—husband and father. The tree and plaque were provided by the Saginaw Bay

Land Conservancy as part of their ongoing

project to plant new trees in the Great Lakes Bay Region. Every tree that is planted and grows helps to scrub 50 pounds of carbon dioxide from our



air. The less carbon dioxide in our air means a deduction in temperature. You too can help with this great project —as a memorial or in thanksgiving—by contacting the Saginaw Bay Land Conservancy—they do have a website. Thank you to Pat Trahan—one of the originators of the Conservancy—for suggesting this project to me. After the planting Reverend Sue blessed the tree and I'm sure it will grow and flourish. We planted it at River Bend West which is off Marquette Street across from the Skate Park.

Remember to move your clocks back one hour before you go to bed on Saturday, November 5th.










Trinity Church Her People, Her Building Then and Now

The Five Baptisms in the New Testament

Though most people are familiar with the sacrament of Holy Baptism where a person is incorporated into the Body of Christ, the Church, and also of the baptism of John the Baptist, most of us are not aware that the New Testament tells us of not one or two, but rather five baptisms.

The first baptism we encounter in the New Testament is the *baptism of repentance* that John the Baptist preached and performed in the Jordan River. Though Jesus needed no baptism as He was sinless, He succumbed to His cousin John's baptism in order to fulfill all the Law and righteousness.

Before praying in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus prays before His passion and death, asking his closest disciples if anyone can be "baptized in the way in which I am to be baptized" and He was speaking of the *baptism of suffering*, meaning the suffering He would encounter in His passion and crucifixion.


After Jesus' death and resurrection we learn of three more baptisms: The *Baptism* in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (or Baptism in the name of the Triune God), the *Baptism* in the name of Jesus only and the *Baptism* in the Holy Spirit.

Before Jesus' Ascension into heaven St. Matthew's gospel records Christ's command to: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." Matthew: 28:19 This is the baptism when a child or adult is welcomed into God's kingdom and made a child of God.

In Acts of the Apostles we learn that some people were baptized in the name of Jesus only, and later to receive power from on high, were baptized in the Holy Spirit receiving power to bear witness to Christ and share the Good News of Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

Here, to our right, we see the humility of Jesus as He who needs no baptism is baptized by His cousin John. Baptism of Our Lord Window, western nave wall; Willet Studios, Philadelphia, PA 1951.
