Dear Trinity Community,

A sacred Holy Week and Easter to you!

Just recently we experienced Tetélestai at Trinity. The love of Christ was experienced through the Passion Play in showing Christ's love for all, and it was also shared in holy conversations with members of the cast and crew, one another, and those with the community who attended.

It was a whirlwind of a weekend that brought us together and then all of a sudden they're gone. But God's Spirit remains in us and in them as the spirit of the visit and all that was shared lingers on.

God's timing is perfect. We've seen this over and over again. Someone once told me they love the way God connects the dots in the lives of people and situations. There were many dots and lives connected this weekend which will make a lasting impact in ways we will never know.

God is like that. Holy Week is like that. Easter is like that. Through the deep love of Jesus for us and the way our lives are connected to him in various ways at various times, we experience healing, joy, and hope in the midst of dis-ease, sadness and despair.

A friend of mine shared that she had been praying for her husband's healing for years. He was in so much pain that he was eventually in a wheelchair, virtually incapacitated. She shared that for years she was angry at God for not healing him nor relieving him of his agony.

She went on to say that a few years ago he was worked through the trauma of his childhood. Having done the hard and difficult work, he is now doing well and is healed! The prayers of my friend were answered in God's timing and in the timing of the one needing healing. This experience has given my friend an understanding of God's wisdom and trustworthiness that is beyond our understanding. Her faith and trust in God has deepened.

Through the Passion of Jesus we experience such a range of emotions. Those who loved Jesus were doing their best to follow him in ways they could. From Mary the mother of Jesus to Judas who betrayed him. From Peter who denied Jesus to Mary Magdalene who never left him. From the misguided religious leaders to the converting centurion. From John the beloved disciple to the temple vendors who were trying to make a living. And the list goes on.

Jesus loved and offered forgiveness to all even when he was dying. His love is eternal and more powerful than anything. You and I are recipients of that immense love. We worship a God who is gentle and merciful, strong and mighty. In God's way, these *are* compatible descriptions!

Praise be to the living God who is gracious, loves us beyond measure and brings us from death into life! To God be the glory forever and ever! Hallelujah!





Then and Now

The Our Father Cross-Stitch Memorial


Located in the west walkway just before entering the nave, several framed needleworks of prayer and devotion grace the walls. This month we look at the *Our Father Cross-stitch Memorial* created by Jeri Anker who honored her mom with this wonderful gift to Trinity Church. Here, we are blessed to have the story in Jeri's own words.

The Lord's Prayer represents my mom, Carol Hogan Phillip's faith. She held strong to it through many tribulations of severe rheumatoid arthritis that held her housebound due to pain and being crippled by the disease. Upon her death in 2004 I wanted to memorialize her with my stitching that she had taught me to do decades before.

This piece was created using 24 different colors of floss, pearl cotton, overdyed floss, metallic floss and gold blending filaments thick as a human hair. When the stitching of full cross stitches, ¼ stitches and outlining was complete, the picture was then embellished with 1/16 inch satin ribbon held in place with couching stitches with cream beads. Other highlights include Victorian gold seed beads and a gold open heart charm.

My work would not have been complete without the insight and craftsmanship of the framing done by Christine Nielsen of the Nielsen Gallery. She guided me in choosing the perfect ultra-suede mat, glass and

frame. Christine also helped me find the best brass plate and personalization to be mounted on the mat. It truly took my breath away when I saw the finished piece. It was lovingly donated to the church in April 2004.



Detail from the *Our Father Cross-stitch Memorial.* Carol Hogan Phillips was a loval member of Trinity Church from an early age. Born and raised in Bay City she spent her entire life here. She was baptized at Trinity at a young age and her faith grew from there. As she grew older her best friends were members of Trinity. Her daughter, Jeri, said her mother loved her church work helping at the bazaar and anything needed. One thing her friends remembered was that no matter how severe the pain she endured, she never complained. May her perseverance, faith and devotion to God, her family and church inspire us.
