Dear Trinity Community,

The time is now, the time is love. Jesus is shining his light in the darkness and the darkness cannot be overcome. We are surrounded by darkness in our world, country and parts of our lives, and, yet, Jesus comes in to illuminate the darkness to reveal all things. Darkness is not dark to our God.

I recently saw a picture on a Facebook post that showed a person at the bottom of a tall, wide, cement stairwell. There was darkness all around except for a ray of light illuminating the bottom steps. It was a reminder that there is a long road ahead and that we need to take each step as it comes.

What is not shown are the many staircases already climbed. This congregation of Trinity, Bay City has climbed many-a staircase and we continue to be faithful followers of the One who illuminates all things that we may move forward in ministry to live more fully into all God is calling us.

It is exciting to be a part of the movement of the Holy Spirit in this place! For the past two months we've had 20 or more people arrive before church on the second Sunday to sing contemporary praise music.

We hosted our first-ever Community Christmas Hymn Sing in which 48 people participated! We even received phone calls from attendees encouraging us to continue this event in the future! It was just a lot of fun!

There are more fun events planned for 2020

that we hope you will enjoy. *And* we hope you will invite your friends and acquaintances to join in as well. We want to share the Good News of God in Christ and we grasp this reality well when we experience the blessing of shared life in community.

There is a groundswell of energy moving us forward. There are many staircases behind us and we are called to look ahead, focused on Christ, to take the next step. Our next step is to pay attention to those whom we encounter in life and simply ask them to join us in community activities and worship.

The decades-old renewal movement *Cursillo* is a four-day retreat which is followed up by something called grouping. Each participant is encouraged to gather weekly in a small group. They may share a meal but the "meat" of the time is focused on Prayer, Study and Action. Each person shares what they did since they last met in these three areas. The wisdom of this lies in the planning of those areas in the upcoming week and the accountability by sharing it with one another. There is no success if there's no plan. To really think about what one will do in one's time of prayer, study and action is key.

The action portion focuses on this simple phrase: Make a friend; Be a friend; Bring a friend to Christ. This means that the weekly action includes paying attention to those with whom one encounters and how God may be calling you to reach out to that person. In this time of making resolutions, I invite you to make a commitment of noticing who God is putting in your path and to plan on letting

them know of the love of God you experience at Trinity and invite them to attend our social and worship events.

Imagine the joy of the staircase behind us next year if each family unit at Trinity brought in one family that became an active part of our community!

### **WORSHIP COMMITTEE**

The Worship Committee has been responding to the feedback you provided in the Worship Survey. As an experiment, beginning this month we will have a special service that is different from our regular services. On January 19 we will have an Instructed Eucharist during which time I will provide teachings on the different aspects of our Eucharistic service with a brief sermon (if any). On February 16, we will use contemporary Christian praise music. For the season of Lent we will use Rite 1, and on March 15 we will have a "high church" Sunday using "smells & bells". April we will offer Morning Prayer as the Liturgy of the Word (beginning of the service) and in May will use Enriching Our Worship which uses more contemporary language. In June we will offer one or more spoken services. Since this is a work in progress, we may be making adjustments along the way as we hear from you.

The Star of Bethlehem

“What star is this with beams so bright  
More beautiful than the noon day light  
It shines to herald forth the King  
And Gentiles to His crib to bring.”

Words: Charles Coffin, 1736;  
(translated from Latin, 1861;  
John Chandler).

The Star of Bethlehem, or Christmas Star, appears only in the nativity story of the Gospel of St. Matthew where “wise men from the East” (Magi) are inspired by the star to travel to Jerusalem. There, they met King Herod of Judea, and asked him:

“Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We have seen His star in the East and have come to pay Him homage.” (Matthew 2:2)

Herod calls his scribes and priests who quote to him that a verse from the Book of Micah interpreted as a prophecy, stating that the Jewish Messiah would be born in Bethlehem to the south of Jerusalem (Micah 5:2). Secretly intending to find and kill the Messiah in order to preserve his own kingship, Herod invites the wise men to return to him on their way home. Warned in a dream, the wise men return to their homelands by a different route.

Although some modern scholars consider the story pious fiction, to many Christians the star was a miraculous sign. Early Church Fathers such as Origen and John Chrysostom claimed that the star fulfilled a prophecy known as the Star Prophecy from the Old Testament:

“A star shall come out of Jacob;  
A scepter shall rise out of Israel.”  
(Numbers 24:17)

To us who believe, the star was indeed a sign. The God who created all the heavens and the earth used his own creation, a celestial light, to lead the Magi and us to the true Light, and Giver of the sign.
